Americans prefer regular coffee to specialized drinks like lattes, cappuccinos, or cold brew. Traditional iced coffee generally ranks higher than lattes and similar special drinks, but cold brew is near the bottom when it comes to most popular beverages among coffee drinkers.

Coffee drinkers younger than 45 are twice as likely as coffee drinkers 45 and older to drink iced coffee.
